An idea of the type of fortified Celtic settlement involved is to be seen from one of the few completely preserved Scordisci fortified settlements at Čarnok on the Crna Bara river near Vrbas (Vojvodina region), also built in the second half of the 2nd c. BC. Situated on a plain between the Danube and Tiza, two distinct phases can be distinguished at Čarnok – an initial open settlement and a later fortified settlement.
