TITLE 1. CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE. CHAPTER 14. ARREST WITHOUT WARRANT. Art. 14.01. OFFENSE WITHIN VIEW. (a) A peace officer or any other person, may, without a warrant, arrest an offender when the offense is committed in his presence or within his view, if the offense is one classed as a felony or as an offense against the public peace.
