The Empirical Rule If X is a random variable and has a normal distribution with mean μ and standard deviation σ , then the Empirical Rule states the following: . About 68% of the x values lie between $-\sigma$ and $+\sigma$ of the mean μ (within one standard deviation of the mean).; About 95% of the x values lie between -2σ and $+2\sigma$ of the mean μ (within two standard deviations of the mean).

The mathematical expectation of an indicator variable can be 0 if there is no occurrence of an event A , and the mathematical expectation of an indicator variable can be 1 if there is an occurrence of an event A . For example, a dice is thrown, the set of possible outcomes is $\{ 1,2,3,4,5,6\}$ and each of this outcome has the same probability $1/6$.
